




POTENTIAL Caroline Mission

The licensed and dually accredited UP Early Childhood Education Center at Caroline Mission provides children, ages six weeks to five years, from low-income families with high-quality early childhood education and care. The services are offered on a sliding scale and include individualized development plans for each child in addition to a strong focus on parent engagement. In 2020, due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Caroline Mission reduced the number of children served by 50% so that social distancing could be maintained. Despite the challenges, UP provided family support via wellness check-ins, drive by birthday celebrations, and virtual educational sessions. Caroline Mission also became a hub for PPE supplies for other south side childhood centers.






After School


With a strong commitment to personal growth and academic success, UP After School provides after school services for elementary aged students in primarily low-income neighborhoods in the St. Louis area. Serving 11 school sites in 2020, after school programming quickly adapted to ever-changing landscape throughout the year and provided in-person and virtual services depending on the school district. To mitigate the technology divide for UP's students, families and staff, laptops and hotspots were provided. Students were also provided with an educational magazine subscription to keep them cognitively engaged throughout the summer.

Summer Enrichment

UP enrichment camps offer fun and enriching activities designed to provide an experiential approach to joyful summer learning. In 2020, UP held three summer enrichment camps (two in person and one virtual). Strategically located in St. Louis City and County, the camps gave children ages 5-12 opportunities for activities such as fitness, studio and performing arts, STEM, and sports - all within the context of promoting healthy social and emotional growth.







Building Resilient Families

Building Resilient Families uses a two generational approach to serving families of our students in both the Early Childhood and School Age programs. We know that for children to be successful, their family must be stable. Building Resilient Families staff work directly with family members to provide basic needs, referrals and support. In 2020, the pandemic shone a bright light on the disparity our families were experiencing. UP responded by providing food, diapers and technology to our families in need.






